Editorial Policy

Contributors to *The Geographical Bulletin* of Gamma Theta Upsilon should follow the general specifications noted below:

1. All manuscripts should be typed double spaced.
2. Margins should be $1\frac{1}{2}$ " on all four sides of $8\frac{1}{2}$ " by 11" paper.
3. Typing must be on one side of the page only.
4. Footnotes must be typed double spaced, numbered and included on a separate sheet—not at the bottoms of the individual pages. Reference numbers in the manuscript must be in parentheses.
5. All tables must be typed double spaced on separate sheets.
6. All line drawings must be in finished form ready for reproduction. They must include titles, source of data when applicable, and figure number when there is more than one in a manuscript.
